"Find a meeting" app. Your dollars are also used to help maintain a 24 hour hotline so that, again, the hand of A.A. is there. The Intergroup office maintains an inventory and sells A.A. books and literature. These purchases also help support the Western Slope Intergroup. Thanks to all of you who provide financial support. ## Miracles to Go

I remember the best AA meeting I ever attended!

It was in in a western town, a noon meeting in an old building next to the railroad tracks. I was new & not talking yet. I hunkered down on the dilapidated couch, comfortable from years of use ,my hat pulled low. Cigarette smoke hung from the ceiling, sunbeams streamed at an angle, landing on a very old wood floor. The coffee was very strong. The meeting began as usual, & a man was called upon to read "How It Works". He began to read very slowly: "Rarely . .Have . .We . .Seen" . .

I thought, this is going to take forever; they should get another person to read.

But they didn't. I looked at the big man struggling to speak each word. His face was scarred & pockmarked. His hands were like mitts. He must have weighed close to 300lbs.One agonizing word after another, and "How It Works" trickled out. The meeting was to end promptly at 1PM. It was 12:35,then 12:40. Everyone was

Silent. No one got up. Forty of us, each had our own thoughts.

For the first time I noticed how many times the word "Honesty" was mentioned in "How it Works".

At 12:45 a wave of something invisible fell over me. I knew I belonged. If there was an answer here for this man, there was going to be one for me. That hour showed me AA at its best ------Unconditional Love & Sincere Hope that progress in our lives can happen! At 12:50 the basket came around. The man was still slowly reading. Everyone had tearful eyes, including me. Who can dispute that a miracle happened that day? This man----

who I learned later, had spent a hard life in prison --- finished the last word of "How It Works" at 12:58 We all stood, held hands & finished simply with the Lords Prayer.
