### From Gene F, Intergroup/Steering Committee Chair

The question that is often received from A.A. members is why does Central Office exist?

Central Office is an A.A. service organization that involves partnership among groups in a community — just as A.A. groups themselves are partnerships of individuals. A Central office is established to carry out certain functions common to all the groups — functions which are best handled by a centralized office — and it is usually maintained, supervised, and supported by these groups in their general interest. It exists to aid the groups in their common purpose of carrying the A.A. message to the alcoholic who still suffers.

A.A. experience has demonstrated that Central offices are critically important in serving that mission. There are nearly 700 Central Offices throughout the world, performing vital A.A. services. These constitute a network of service outlets and A.A. contacts to help carry the A.A. message to the still suffering alcoholic.

Basic services that our Central Office offers include:

**A.A. Inquiries** — By providing a website that also connects to AA Meeting Guide App, the Central Office receives inquiries via contact form on our website, email and by phone from those seeking help. The Central Office refers the caller to a nearby A.A. group, where sponsorship may be arranged, or have an AA member on our 12th Step Call List contact them.

**Office Facilities** — The Central Office maintains an office in which paid workers and 45 volunteers coordinate local A.A. services including manning our 800# hotline 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.

**Meeting Lists and Other Literature** — Central Office sells A.A. literature for the convenience of local A.A. groups and members and maintains information on 460 A.A. meetings in Western Colorado

**Information Exchange** — Central Office acts as a clearinghouse for the exchange of information among A.A. groups and districts in Western Colorado typically during monthly Intergroup meetings and with daily interactions with A.A. members.

**Bridge the Gap** - This is a temporary contact program designed to help the alcoholic in treatment make the transition back home. The temporary contact will take a newcomer to Alcoholics Anonymous meetings, introduce him or her to other A.A. members, ensure that he or she has the phone numbers of several AA members, and share the experience of sponsorship and a home group.

## News From GSO/AAWS



April 6, 2026

Dear A.A. Friends:

Warm greetings – we hope this letter finds you well.

We are reaching out to provide an update on upcoming changes to the list prices for AAWS digital downloads, including e-books and audio-books. At its March 6th meeting, the AAWS Board approved the new pricing. The e-book price for A.A. in Prison will remain unchanged at \$2.99. These updates will take effect on May 4, 2026.

The last price increase occurred in 2023, with a prior adjustment in 2022. This change is part of our ongoing effort to implement “normalized list prices,” aligning pricing as closely as possible across our various literature formats, including print.

Please note that the list prices for AAWS print materials and other physical media items (CDs and DVDs) were previously adjusted, effective February 1, 2026. A detailed price list is attached for your reference.

### General Service Board Meeting

The General Service Board of Alcoholics Anonymous, Inc. held its quarterly meeting at the Westin New York Hotel at Times Square on Monday, February 2, 2026. Scott H., chair of the General Service Board, presided. All committees met during the weekend. Highlights of committee reports appear below:

### Quarterly Financial Report

#### Discussion on QFR being made accessible on aa.org:

The committee discussed making the Quarterly Financial Report (QFR) accessible on the Contributions and Self-Support section of aa.org and took no action. The committee emphasized the need for context, delegate readiness to field questions, and the distinction between providing the QFR upon request versus posting it publicly. The committee leaned toward completing the website inventory first and returned with a broader recommendation, with suggestion that the Conference Committee on Finance may consider the topic.

#### E-book Page Number Innovation!

You can view print page numbers in our Kindle e-books

Dear A.A. Friends,

Warm greetings from the General Service Office.

We're pleased to share that “Page in Book” display is now available for our Kindle e-books.

This feature, which has been requested by many A.A. members, allows readers to view the same page numbers that appear in the print edition of a book on a Kindle device or in the Kindle app.

This feature can be especially helpful for members who are reading along together with their sponsees and sponsors, either at the kitchen table or in meetings, workshops, and study groups. We can now follow the same page references used in the printed book.

#### How to enable the “Page in Book” feature

If you do not see page numbers at the bottom of your screen, you can turn them on by following these steps:

#### On a Kindle eReader (Paperwhite, Oasis, or Basic Kindle):

1. While reading, tap near the **top of the screen** to open the menu.
2. Tap **“Aa” (Font)**.
3. Select the **“More”** tab.
4. Under **Reading Progress**, choose **“Page in Book.”**

#### On the Kindle App (iPhone, iPad, or Android):

1. While reading, tap the **center of the screen**.
2. Tap **“Aa” (Font)**.
3. Select **“More.”**
4. Under **Reading Progress**, choose **“Page in Book.”**

Once activated, the page number displayed will correspond to the page number in the print edition.

### Highlights of GSO 2026 Budget:

The budget projects operating expenses of \$19,765,699 and operating revenue of \$21,118,201, resulting in an operating surplus of \$1,352,503 before depreciation and \$918,503 after \$434,000 Grapevine support (subject to Grapevine board approval). Major cost reductions were highlighted, including no printed Conference reports and reductions to Conference-related spending (including food/service). Included was a recommended \$250,000 addition to the Reserve Fund and a projected net cash outflow of \$11,103. Since we began 2026 with \$447,170 cash on hand, this leaves a projected cash on hand of \$436,067 at year end.

### AA Grapevine

#### *Apps*

In the month of December 2025, we added 192 active app subscribers for Grapevine and four for La Viña. Grapevine active app subscribers grew by 35% in 2025 compared to 2024. We released the apps in the European Union on January 11, 2026. The apps are now available worldwide. Since the EU release we now have app subscribers in Germany, Sweden, Spain, Belgium, Norway, Denmark, Lithuania, France, Italy, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Portugal, Austria, Finland, Poland, and Switzerland, totaling over 100.

#### *App Income from Apple and Google to Date*

Since our last Grapevine Board meeting on December 13, 2025, we've received payments of \$28,230 from Apple and \$4,546 from Google, and the total received over lifetime of apps is now \$456,867.

#### *GV Total Subscriptions (print, digital, apps)*

December: Print: 41,258; Complete: 5,564; Online: 4,219; App: 7,532; **Total: 58,574**

Total subscriptions are 439 over the July 2025 reforecast with online and apps leading the way.

#### *GV Total Subscriptions (print, digital, apps)*

December: Print: 7,298; Complete: 162; Online: 92; App: 399; **Total: 7,951**

Total subscriptions are 594 under reforecast. We did sell 500 gift subscriptions in one large order in December, but it will take time for these to be distributed and redeemed.

From Central Office Manager

I feel the need to rant! There is always such a clamor to support GSO, but I would like to make the case for supporting your local Central Office! Alcoholics Anonymous World Services, Inc. (AAWS) is the publishing and service arm of the A.A. General Service Office (GSO) in New York City. Its purpose is to manage the publication, translation, and distribution of A.A. literature and support A.A. groups across the U.S., Canada, and worldwide. But have you requested help for AAWS lately? Call 212-870-3400 and ask for help. If they answer, which is a 50/50 chance, they will tell you to call 888-333-9649, which is the Central Office phone number. If you want to find a meeting, go to [aa.org](http://aa.org) and click "Find AA Near You" and enter your zip code. You will be directed to [aa-westerncolorado.com](http://aa-westerncolorado.com), which is the Central Office website. The Meeting Guide app might be handy, but it is only as good as the information provided by OUR website, because that is the data that is used to create meeting guide app. I feel like Central Office is the RED HEADED STEPCCHILD that does all the work and AAWS takes all the credit!

Lastly, some Groups are in an uproar because Central Office is breaking traditions by selling non-conference approved literature. What tradition are we breaking???? Serious question! Please call me and tell me what tradition we are breaking. We have been selling Grapevine books forever yet AA Grapevine is not conference approved per the definition outlined in SMF-29 (<https://www.aa.org/conference-approved-literature>), even though Grapevine is almost fully supported by AAWS. Not All "A.A. Literature" Is Conference-Approved according to SMF-29. Central offices and intergroups can write and may distribute pamphlets or booklets that are not Conference-approved. If such pieces meet the needs of the local membership, they may be legitimately classified as "A.A. literature." There is no conflict between A.A. World Services and central offices or intergroups – rather they complement each other. The Conference does not disapprove of such material. So I am asking you to consider who is actually supporting you and your group. And before you withdraw support from Central Office for selling non-conference approved literature, please ask yourselves if your reasons are justified. Thank you for listening! Teresa M

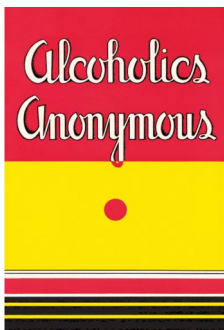

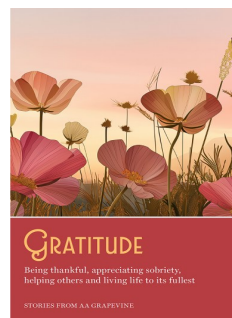
