Imagine that the four tires on your car symbolize your spirit, your knowledge, your dreams, and your feelings. If even one of these is out of balance, your car will not run smoothly. It will need more guidance to stay on the road. It will use up more gasoline. And over time, each of the other tires will wear unevenly.

In your recovery you may have three tires that are usually in balance with one another, and one that is not. If you are holding on to feelings of resentment, anger, or sadness, it can be difficult to embrace the present. If you are suppressing your feelings rather than expressing them, it can be harder for you to stay focused. And if you believe that the feelings of others are more important than your own, you may have a difficult time accepting and gaining a better understanding of what it is that you need.

Your tire of feelings is out of balance. Even if it is hard for you to express your feelings, write down how you feel. The more you can feel, the greater balance you can achieve in your life.

I will not ignore my feelings. I will let them out so I can feel them.
